• Progress Reports:

- Recent learning reports (no grades) were uploaded onto MyEd.

• Reporting Framework for secondary students:

- Aligns with new curriculum: Competency driven, personalized and flexible, focus on literacy and numeracy foundations and Indigenous perspectives, worldviews and woven into all areas of learning areas and grades.
- Report cards will focus on learning instead of competing for marks.
- What is consistent, 5 reporting events, 3 written and 2 informal reports. Letter grades and percentages 10-12, written feedback K-9, student self-assessment of Core Competencies K-9. Student self-assessment included in 10-12 now.
- Emerging, means beginning to understand. Developing, means they're understanding some things. Proficient is the goal for your child. Extending: when students show a full understanding.
