### Approval of Minutes from October:

#### **Principal's Report:**

#### MYED Reporting and 24/25 Course Selection:

- On the next report card, parents will see an extra course. This is a section for student reflection which will be an ongoing feature on report cards.
- Course selection is from April 8<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup>.
- Course selection will be done directly on MYED.
- Both students and parents have access to MYED.
- For current grade 11 students, be sure to look at post-secondary requirements to ensure the correct grade 12 prerequisite courses have been chosen.
- Note: IDS courses are valuable for portfolios. However, post-secondary institutions may not count them as a required academic course to meet entrance requirements. Check each post-secondary institution for their specific entrance requirements.
- Reach out to the IHUB counsellors for help with course selection and to ensure the students have selected their required courses for graduation and post-secondary applications.
- Opportunities to apply for scholarships start in September of the grade 12 year. The
  application deadline and requirements differ for each scholarship.
- Reach out to the IHUB counsellors for information regarding scholarships.
- The IHUB counsellors post information on the Student Services Team on Microsoft Teams. For grade 12 specifically, the students can find information on open houses for post-secondary institutions and scholarships that are available.

#### **PAC Fundraisers and Donations:**

#### • 2<sup>nd</sup> Purdy's Fundraiser

o \$151 raised so far.

#### • Online store for Inquiry Hub

- o The idea was proposed to the PAC.
- o Set up an online store in which the students can upload their designs, and families can order those designs on selected products such as hoodies, mugs, etc.
- o PAC spent 4 months researching the idea to set up the store.
- o Partly due to ongoing fees, copyright issues and required hours to set up and run the store, the PAC has proposed the following:
- o It is recommended that the student artists set up their own stores on whichever platform they choose.
- o The sites are designed to be run by the artist. The process is much more streamlined if the artists are making the decisions.
- o Teepublic doesn't have any set up or user fees.
- o Once their store is set up, if the student chooses, the PAC can help promote their sites in order to support student artists at IHUB.
- o If the students choose, they may dedicate their profits to a variety of fundraisers, which may include graduation, the Europe trip or PAC initiatives.
- o Stephanie is happy to share PAC research into the various platforms available.

#### New Fundraiser Proposed: Clothing/Books Sale

- o Proposal for a new fundraiser to support the spring formal.
- o If successful could become an annual fundraiser so that future students also benefit.
- o Ask families to donate clothing/books gently, used in good condition.
- o Host a one-day sale in the IHUB gym.

- o All items sell for \$1 each.
- o Items that are left over can be donated to Value Village and receive cash back.
- o Mr. Truss confirmed there is room at the school to store donations for a week.
- o Need approximately 10 volunteers to sort clothing and books, work on the sale day, and organize leftover donations to be delivered to Value Village.
- o Zero risk as there is no initial cost.
- o Noelene has offered to lead the fundraiser, Kathleen, Rebecca and Stephanie have volunteered to help.
- o PAC will send out a message to the parent community to start organizing their donations.
- o Need to specify a date/time for donation drop-off.
- o PAC to request volunteers.
- o Dave will discuss the best timing with staff, aiming for early spring.
- o Will confirm the details at the next PAC meeting on April 8th.
- o ONLY Clothes and Books will be accepted.
- **o** IHUB shares the building with Suwa'lkh School. Families here will be invited to participate.
- Noelene Ahern made a motion to approve the Clothing Drive fundraiser to support the senior spring formal; it was seconded by Kathleen James and approved by all.

#### **Update from Matthew on Grade 12 Grad Initiatives:**

- Students have fundraised \$300 so far, which is approximately 1/3 of their target budget.
- Students will select a date for Me and Ed's Fundraiser. The proceeds will go towards the grad initiatives.
- Matthew confirmed with the school and PAC that there are no legal issues to clarify with the school. This is a student organized and lead event, not an official school or PAC event. IHUB and the PAC are hands-off.
- Students are still determining the grad events. Possible ideas are McDonalds back yard party, day trip to Aquarium or the Rec Room, dinner out at a restaurant such as the Boat House.
